Second view is that of a family who lives in Gran Rapids Michigan, 1996. They are a normal family, no different than any other. But they are the ancestors of the girl from 2317. They are living their normal lives in a blizzard in a winter in Michigan. They think that they're house is haunted by a ghost, but it is actually the girl from the future. Each time they are seen, it is from a different family members viewpoint. And sometimes it is about the ghost and other times it is not. It follows the families relationships and sometimes it doesn't.

In the future, there are visa, passports and licenses for traveling time, but they can be obtained with all the proper paperwork and all the proper documentation

The girl from the future always goes back to the same family during the same season. It is near Christmas or just after or shortly before, etc and a lot of family is visiting.

But, what is the ultimate purpose of this story? What are the characters goals in their respective lives? Perhaps the girl from the future wants to know what happened to the world. But that is silly. There are more than enough sources of documentation about the world all over the internet. There are e-books to no end. Sources of knowledge to no end. But writing literature has changed. It has been degraded to blogs and unverifiable sources of information. This girl wants truth. She wants reality, She wants to live in the past. She finds it more appealing that her present. She spends all her money on time travel just so she can go to see this family as often as possible. Maybe the ultimate thing is that she is able to break the time travel laws, she finds a loop hole in the travel and finds a way into the past. During this time the family humorously deals with the ghost and family issues throughout the holiday. And when the future girl makes it to the past, she visits this family in real time, after that Christmas, and they take her in. She starts dating one of the

boys and lives happily ever after. There is not enough conflict yet. I need to think about that a little more perhaps....

General Idea Notes:

All time travelers/ghosts would be naked

Electronics have sounds/ions in the air

Vibrations from said electronics resonate with the human eye causing it to vibrate also and blur, thus "seeing" things the human can't explain or thinks is a ghost

Heat can reside in nonliving places (humans could have just walked on a concrete floor) and then when you point thermal camera at that area, you can still see footprints.

Theory of how time travel could work...

All current time travel theories primarily remain grounded based on the fact that nothing could possibly travel faster than the speed of light, right?

I personally think we will certainly find a way to travel faster than light, and thus be able to inevitably travel through time.

My theory centers on black holes, which I known are a vague subject because very little is known about them, but I think that we could gather enough information to argue for time travel.

First, we all can agree that as of now, as far as we know, a black hole is a 3 dimensional hole from which there is no escape. All matter in the universe (that we know of) gets sucked into a black hole and does something unknown in the black hole or gets crushed to itty bitty pieces.

But here is the tricky part. Black holes suck light into them too, right?

A light beam could be heading past a black hole minding its own business and out of nowhere the black hole (being the bully that it is) pulls light off its course.

A point in our history where color means nothing. Similar to surrogates in virtual space. Like Gamer with Surrogates. Take that idea and add a physical aspect with the Time Travel aspect. Buy server space. World in digital world. Jobs still relevant but applied to digital world.

The world is entirely animated. Animation and special effects don't have the same aspect. Things looking more and more human and natural is the big goal. What happens after this? A true moment in the history of art when it has to be real.
